



Egypt and the main UN Road Transport Agreements and Conventions





(1) Road transport and road Traffic safety

- Convention on Road Traffic, of 1968;
- Convention on Road Signs and Signals, of 1968;
- Convention on the Contract for the International Carriage of Goods by Road (CMR), of 1956 and its protocols, in particular the eCMR Protocol;
- European Agreement concerning the Work of Crews of Vehicles Engaged in International Road Transport (AETR), of 1970;

Egypt is working on the study of European Agreement concerning the Work of Crews of Vehicles Engaged in International Road Transport (AETR), of 1970;





(2) Border crossing facilitation

- The Customs Convention on the International Transport of Goods under Cover of TIR Carnets, of 1975 (TIR Convention);
- International Convention on the Harmonization of Frontier Controls of Goods, Geneva, of 1982 (Harmonization Convention);
- The Customs Convention on the Temporary Importation of Private Road Vehicles, of 1954;
- The Customs Convention on the Temporary Importation of Commercial Road Vehicles, of 1956.

Egypt has nearly finished the study of joining TIR convention.





(3) Transport of dangerous goods and perishable foodstuffs

- European Agreement concerning the International Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Road (ADR), of 1957 and its protocols;
- Agreement on the International Carriage of Perishable Foodstuffs and on the Special Equipment to be Used for such Carriage (ATP), of 1970;

The rules of these agreements are very important and must be followed in all cases, even if Egypt do not join them .





(4) Vehicle regulations

- Agreement concerning the Adoption of Uniform Technical Prescriptions for Wheeled Vehicles Equipment and Parts which can be fitted and/or be used on Wheeled Vehicles and the Conditions for Reciprocal Recognition of Approvals Granted on the Basis of These Prescriptions, of 1958;
- Agreement concerning the Establishing of Global Technical Regulations for Wheeled Vehicles, Equipment and Parts which can be fitted and/or be used on Wheeled Vehicles, of 1998;
- Agreement concerning the Adoption of Uniform Conditions for Periodical Technical Inspections of Wheeled Vehicles and the Reciprocal Recognition of such Inspections, of 1997.

Egypt is a contracting party of the UN 1958 Agreement.





Challenges on the road to joining:

- The multiplicity of stakeholders in each agreement and the difficulty of coordination between them.
- Relative extensive need for Regulations and legislation update.
- The road transport sector is fragmented with low level of professional qualification for company managers, truck owners and professional drivers;
- Getting old fleet of trucks in operation;

Transportation sector development:

- Over the past few years the Egyptian highway network have doubled to about 24,000 km.
- Several initiatives to upgrade the highway specifications and standards.
- Bilateral trade facilitation agreements with regional countries.
- Establishment on new governmental bodies to help in the implementation of national transportation network
