




Road Safety Data regional activity

AETR Agreement



- Driver fatigue increases the risk of serious road accidents.
- Non-standardized working hours create disparities and impact competition
- Prevents drivers from driving excessive hours and defines control devices
- Training in Algeria, Egypt, Jordan, Morocco and Tunisia by EuroMed
- But AETR was not open to non UNECE member States
- Following interest and orchestrated efforts and support of UNECE,
 EU, Turkey, Ukraine AETR opened to these countries, on 5 July 2016
- Efforts are ongoing for the accession of these countries to AETR and for its opening also to Lebanon
- Expression of interest by Lebanon in 79th ITC February 2017, AETR
 GE 12 June 2017 and the final effort planned for 16-18 October

- Build capacity of Lebanese authorities to prepare for accession and implementation
- Highlight the importance of adherence to the AETR Agreement to improve the road safety performance of professional drivers;
