




Project objectives



Which UNECE Road Transport Agreements are most important and Why?




Which Agreements



13 most important out of total 58

- Road transport and road traffic safety (4 Agreements)
- Border crossing facilitation (4 Agreements)
- Transport of dangerous goods and perishable foodstuffs (2 Agreements)
- Vehicle Regulations (3 Agreements)





Why they are important?



- Basic technical and regulatory framework
- Internationally harmonised rules and standards
- Models for developing related national legislation
- Facilitate international road transport and make it possible and efficient
- Legally binding reciprocal recognition of certificates
- Constantly updated, brought in line with EU regulations
- Elaborated by consensus (minimum standards and rules)
- No accession fees
- Applied worldwide
- European legacy to international community





Issues for consideration



UN Agreements Not well explored in the region



Road transport and road traffic safety

- ✓ AETR not open to non-UNECE countries till July 2016
- ✓ Road Safety Agreements 1968 some confusion with those of 1949

Border crossing facilitation

- ✓ TIR not really applicable in EuroMed region
- ✓ Harmonisation Convention not well known

Transport of dangerous goods and perishable foodstuffs

- ✓ ADR very complex often applied partially
- ✓ Sea journeys longer 150 km not subject to ATP

Vehicle Regulations

✓ Not understood why important to non-car producing nations

Of more generic character

- ✓ Financial and technical difficulties
- ✓ Lack of capacity to accede and implement
- ✓ Country and sub-regional specificities putting obstacles
