Agreement on the International Carriage of Perishable Foodstuffs and on the Special Equipment to be Used for such Carriage (ATP), 1970



- Objective
- Improve conditions of preservation of quality of perishable foodstuffs during carriage, particularly in international trade and promote the expansion of trade in perishable foodstuffs.

•49 Contracting Parties



Agreement on the International Carriage of Perishable Foodstuffs and on the Special Equipment to be Used for such Carriage (ATP), 1970



- Benefits:
- Harmonised standards for refrigerating equipments
- Facilitated border procedure for perishable foodstuff and live animals
- Preserved quality of goods during transport and prevention of disease proliferation
- Regular inspection of vehicles and mutual recognition of ATP certificates of compliance issued by the competent authorities of other Contracting Parties



Agreement on the International Carriage of Perishable Foodstuffs and on the Special Equipment to be Used for such Carriage (ATP), 1970



Benefits:


- •ATP applies even if the state where the goods are loaded is not a Contracting Party.
- Some Contracting Parties also use ATP for domestic transport

ADR: (European) Agreement concerning the International Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Road

AT LEAST TWO OF THE BELOW MENTIONED CONTRACTING PARTIES



Advantages for Contracting Parties



✓ Transit or importing countries

- High level of transport safety
- Close cooperation with other Contracting Parties and mutual trust
- Mechanisms for solving disputes

✓ Exporting countries

- Border-crossing and transit facilitation
- No additional requirements imposed by transit or destination countries
- Recognition of certificates by other Contracting Parties
- Close cooperation with other Contracting Parties and mutual trust
- Mechanisms for solving disputes

IRU Academy Programmes







KPI*s after training

- Reduction in accidents; 46%
- Reduction in man-days loss per year; 25%
- Decrease in revenues loss; 48%
- Decrease in repair costs; 17%
- Reduction in number of damaged deliveries; 51%

Reduction in IVMS violations; 58%

- Reduction in fuel consumption; 14%
- Reduction in maintenance and repair; 20%


Transport efficiency

- For every \$1 spent on training, around \$17 were saved
- Calculated as 1632 % out of which 138% attributable to improved Road Safety






Tasks of the Group of Experts on the Transport of Dangerous Goods:


- Monitor, analyse and make proposals to various international bodies on the regulation of the transport of dangerous goods


