UN Secretary General's Special Envoy on Road Safety

- United Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon announced on 29 April 2015 the appointment of Jean Todt as his Special Envoy for Road Safety.
- to help mobilize sustained political commitment at the global level towards making road safety a priority worldwide
- UNECE, which is the custodian of the UN road safety legal instruments, will act as the secretariat for the Special Envoy.

Why does it matter?

Why vehicle regulations?

Several versions of a given model, because:

- Left Hand Drive
- Right Hand Drive
- The US/Canada version
- The Rest of the World (e.g. for countries with low fuel quality)...











Eligible Contracting Parties to the 1958 Agreement:

Members of UN

The 1958 Agreement provides:

Legal framework for the adoption of uniform UN Regulations on vehicle approval (performance and test requirements, conformity of production and administrative provisions)

Reciprocal recognition of Type Approval Approved once and accepted everywhere (CPs)







All vehicle parts and systems approved according to UN Regulations under the 1958
 Agreement bear the unique E -marking



• The Type-Approval with an approval number and the approval date + test reports



- 1958 Agreement provides the legal framework for the establishment and amendment of harmonized technical United Nations Regulations for wheeled vehicle, equipments and parts,
- Conditions for reciprocal recognition of approvals granted on basis of these UN Regulations.

Construction of Safer and more Environmentally friendly vehicles

- Today 145 UN Regulations annexed to the 1958 Agreement
- 55 Contracting Parties



- Better road safety and lower pollutant emissions
- Mutual recognition of type approvals under UN Regulations
- Elimination of technical barriers to trade
- Facilitation in elaboration of national vehicle regulations by applying UN Regulations
- Flexibility in application of UN Regulations (Country selects which UN Regulation and notifies)
- Keep pace with technological development (both administration, technical services but also national industry)
- Protect country and citizen from sub-standard vehicles by mandatory applying UN Regulations



Main Provisions of the 1958 Agreement

- Legal framework to establish UN Regulations and amendments to existing ones for wheeled vehicles, equipment and parts which can be fitted and/or be used on wheeled vehicles;
- New UN Regulations and amendments to existing UN Regulations are established by a vote of four-fifths majority of contracting parties;
- Contracting parties can decide not to apply the new UN Regulations and the amendments to existing ones;
- Contracting party that applyes any UN Regulation is allowed to grant type approvals and is required to accept type approvals granted by any other contracting party applying it;
- Contracting parties granting type approvals are required to have the technical competence to ensure the performance of the tests and the competence to ensure conformity of production



Main Provisions of the 1958 Agreement

- 8 Schedules of Administrative and Procedural Provisions:
 - Schedule 1: Conformity of production procedures
 - Schedule 2:
 - Part one: Assessment, designation and notification of technical services
 - Part two: Standards which the technical services shall comply with
 - Part three: Procedure for the assessment of technical services
 - Schedule 3: Procedures for UN type approvals
 - Schedule 4: Numbering of UN type approvals
 - Schedule 5: Circulation of approval documentation (DETA and Unique Identifyer UI)
 - Schedule 6: Procedures for resolving interpretation issues
 - Schedule 7: Procedure for exemption approvals concerning new technologies
 - Schedule 8: General conditions for virtual testing methods



Main Provisions of UN Regulations

- The UN Regulations annexed to the 1958 Agreement shall include:
 - Technical performance based requirements;
 - Test methods by which performance requirements are verified; (b)
 - The conditions for granting type approvals; (c)
 - (d) The conditions for the reciprocal recognition of the type approvals;
 - Provisions for the marking of vehicles, their equipment and parts to identify and verify the vehicles to be registered;
 - (f) The conditions for ensuring the conformity of production (COP);
 - Conditions for in service conformity; (g)
 - Conditions for recyclability of vehicles. (h)
